



GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT IN THE COMMUNITY SECTOR:

Building and sustaining an effective relationship

The success or failure of an organisation relies on the effectiveness of its governance and management. A poor relationship between the two can be devastating. Within the community sector there is often a blurring of the responsibilities so that trustees and managers aren't sure who should be doing what.

This workshop will provide participants with the knowledge and skills to make positive changes that will ensure their organisation becomes more effective. Participants will leave the workshop with practical knowledge that can be used immediately. Topics covered will include:

- ⤴ A clear understanding of what is the responsibility of governance and what is the responsibility of management;
- ⤴ Practical advice on effective governance (from the big picture questions such as what is the role and what are the responsibilities, to practical skills on how to run an effective meeting and be an effective Chair);
- ⤴ Practical advice on effective management (strategic management, people management, evaluation and monitoring and managing funding);
- ⤴ Usable strategies to achieve a successful relationship between governance and management
