


Taranaki Business Survey

- Monitors economic confidence by Taranaki businesses and their views on key business issues.
- Undertaken by Venture Taranaki 6-monthly since 1999.
- Survey sent to over 1500 Taranaki businesses.
- Cross section of industry type, location and size.
- Spans a number of standard economic questions.
- Plus a special topic: Destination Taranaki:
 - Interest from Aucklanders to relocate here
 - Tourism/visitors infrastructural needs



NZ Economic Conditions: next 12 months





Industry conditions - next 12 months




Positivity continues to edge?

Sales: next 6 months




Potentially better six months ahead than same time last year?

- Don't know: 1%






Other factors impacting on business

Experiencing Skill Shortages



Skill shortages up slightly.

72% - no skill shortages

28% of Taranaki businesses report skill shortages or difficulties recruiting appropriate staff.

Skills shortages mentioned

- Chefs, senior F&B
- Mechanical fitters
- Trained scaffolders
- Skilled carpenters
- Bakers
- Medical staff including after hours personnel
- Construction industry and technical
- Plumbers

- Immigration laws are making it harder
- Hard to find skilled staff
- Worker attitude challenging
- Finding reliable unqualified labourers is virtually impossible.












Interest in Leaving Auckland? comparison

Factors Taranaki could use to help encourage


Aucklanders to relocate to Taranaki

- "Do we really want Aucklanders to come here?"


