



Branching Out | Medicinal Plants



Today is the culmination of an activity that has:

- been a truly collaborative exercise: Venture Taranaki, the Stratford Herb Society and our community
- involved over thirty local growers with more participation to come
- attracted 150 registrants (attending in-person and via Zoom) from across the value-chain landowners, interested growers, consumer product entrepreneurs, and potential investors

Support and interest in medicinal plants as a commercial opportunity has reinforced our region's capabilities:

- land and climate suitability
- skills and knowledge in the region, willingness to share this to enable the industry development
- considerable strength in food production and processing sectors with capabilities and experiences that can be applied to this industry, readiness to do so
- collective belief across the value chain that Taranaki is well positioned for a thriving medicinal plants industry.

- To provide an understanding of what is needed to enable a thriving Taranaki medicinal plants industry

Using maps to identify opportunities and foster collaboration

- Response to widespread interest in the opportunity, as demonstrated by participation in developing the longlist with Stratford Herb Society.
- Opportunity to provide information to support the commercialisation of a medicinal plants industry and assist decision-making
- Interactive visuals will engage growers and the public and assist in identifying clusters of growers to encourage commercial viability.

Ultimately it is hoped that this might form the basis for organised collaboration around commercially growing medicinal plants – initially supported by Venture Taranaki.
